In 2001, the State of Maine's Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) sought a replacement solution for its 30-year old MMIS. Comprised of obsolete technology, the legacy system had become increasingly difficult and costly to maintain. Singh led a team of more than 60 individuals ranging from programmers, quality assurance, business and functional analysts to design and implement Maine's new Medicaid system. Singh and his team built the system from the ground up, leveraging the latest methodologies and software technologies in its design approach. Susan Fox, president of Fox Systems, has worked closely with Singh.

For 19 years, FOX Systems has provided consultation to federal, state, and local healthcare clients in the selection and implementation of IT solutions. Fox stated, "Arvinder stands out in a field of many achievers as a visionary who grasps the importance of IT advances and is able to synthesize into useful applications for the healthcare enterprise."Based on its MMIS project with Maine, CNSI has won awards for MMIS implementations in two other states (Washington and Michigan), which will add more than \$100 million in revenue for the organization over the next five years.
